HOW CAN I PROTECT MYSELF AND MY FAMILY

KNOW HOW IT SPREADS

There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus, which is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person (within about 6 feet of one another). Respiratory droplets are produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of others who are nearby and can lead to inhalation into the lungs.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after you have been in a public place or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Put distance between yourself and other people. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

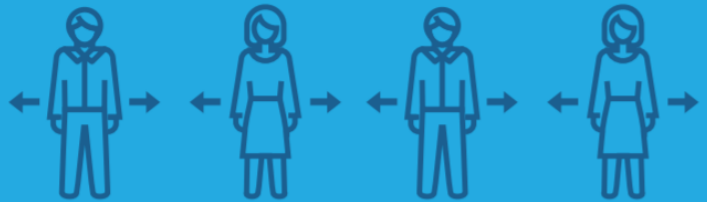


Wash your hands with soap and water regularly.

- Wet your hands with clean, running water
- Lather your hands completely with soap
- Scrub for at least 20 seconds
- Rinse your hands well
- Dry with a clean towel or by air drying.

Keep your distance

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Close contact is defined as being within approximately 6 feet.



Clean and disinfect surfaces frequently

- Doorknobs
- Counters
- Tabletops
- Bathroom fixtures
- Toilets
- Phones/Tablets
- Bedside tables

CLARK COUNTY'S EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ROLE

Clark County plays a leading role when emergencies occur in our community, and we have taken many proactive steps to help contain the spread of coronavirus. We are working closely with local, state and federal health officials, and organizations across the state to implement safety measures, and to keep the public informed and advised of useful steps they can take.

We have activated our Multi-Agency Coordination Center (MACC) to coordinate our multi-agency response to the outbreak. Managed by our Fire Department's Office of Emergency Management, the MACC is comprised of representatives from numerous agencies that are working together on a coordinated response as the situation continues to evolve. Agencies include the Southern Nevada Health District, the local cities, local police and fire departments, utility companies, the Clark County School District, and the State of Nevada.

As a result of the public health threat posed by COVID-19 and the impacts to hospital emergency rooms, government agencies, local businesses, residents and visitors, Clark County has issued a Declaration of Emergency. This coincides with the Governor's Declaration of Emergency, allowing us to request resources from the state and federal government, and also provides county management with the flexibility to adjust staffing levels in response to the emergency. At the Governor's direction, Clark County is currently operating with essential personnel only.
